Eligibility to work in the UK:

In line with the Asylum and Immigration Act 1996 all candidates are required to bring proof of eligibility to work in the United Kingdom - information regarding suitable documents is below. Please note that we would not be able to make any offer of employment without sight of these documents.

You must provide 1 from list or a combination from list 2 or 3.

List 1
